The 'Generating Health' and 'Incarnation' Challenges

We have asked Matthias Girke to tackle two groups of conditions that have come to the fore in the context of current societal and cultural pressures and stress. On the one hand he will discuss sleep disorders; the challenge of entering sleep, so that it is renewing at night. On the other hand he will discuss metabolic disorders; the challenges of fully penetrating our bodies in the day with activity and engagement with life. These metabolic disorders are increasing not only in later life but also in young people and children.

Generating Our Own Spiritual and Soul Health and our Communal Incarnation Challenges

At a time when any approach to medicine other than materialistic reductionist medicine is being suppressed by economic, administrative and academic pressures; how can more spiritual approaches sustain themselves organisationally? These will be questions taken up in our own group work and in Matthias's Lectures.
